Section 1.0 Title, Enactment, Effective Date,
Purpose, and Definitions.

1.1. Title

This Local Law shall be entitled, "Local Law No. 3 of 2010: Amending Chapter 10 of the Saltaire Village Code amending Regulations Regarding Night Bike Riding in the Village of Saltaire."

1.2. Enactment.

Pursuant to Section 10 of the Home Rule Law, and the Village Law of the State of New York, the Incorporated Village of Saltaire, County of Suffolk and State of New York, hereby enacts by this Local Law 3 of 2010, a Local Law of the Incorporated Village of Saltaire.

1.3. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect on the filing of the approved Local Law with the Secretary of State of New York, which shall be within twenty (20) days after its approval by the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Saltaire.

1.4. Findings

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Saltaire hereby finds that with proper regulations that are set forth in this Chapter 10 of the Saltaire Village Code and the enforcement of those regulations that it is a proper action of the Board of Trustees to rescind the provisions of Section 10-2 of the Saltaire Village Code and to eliminate the restrictions on night bike riding subject to the regulations of this Chapter. The provisions in this Chapter 10 establish the regulations for bike riding in the Village of Saltaire for enforcement by Saltaire Security Officers, and are not in derogation of applicable provisions of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law which are enforceable by other enforcement agencies.

1.5. Purpose and Intent of Local Law.

The purpose and intent of this Local Law are to eliminate the restrictions on night bike riding except for the use of lights contained in this local law.

2.0 General Provisions

2.1 Repeal of 10-2 of the Saltaire Village Code.

Section 10.2 of the Saltaire Village Code and the subsections contained in that

Section 10.2 are hereby repealed.

2.2 Adoption of new Section 10-2 of the Saltaire Village Code

“§ 10.2 Lights and Other Equipment”

- A. Every bicycle when in use during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise shall be equipped with (i) a working headlight projecting forward from the front of the bicycle and (ii) a red or amber light projecting backward from the rear of the bicycle or a red or amber reflector permanently mounted on the rear of the bicycle. The headlight shall emit a white light visible during hours of darkness from a distance of at least two hundred (200) feet to the front of the bicycle. The red or amber light or reflector shall be visible from a distance of at least one hundred (100) feet to the rear. All required lighting equipment shall be securely affixed to the bicycle or held by the rider in such a manner that the lighting equipment is stable, projects its light forward without interruption or obstruction, and does not interfere with or obstruct the safe operation of the bicycle by the rider.
- B. Penalties for offenses. Violation of any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50) for a first offense and of not less than seventy-five dollars (\$75) for each subsequent offense committed within three years of the last such offense.

3.0 Severability and Validity

3.1 Severability and Validity

In the event that any portion or portions of this Local Law 3 of 2010 shall be determined to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of the Local Law, and its provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
