ADJOURN INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION

Trustee Wolf made a motion at 8:01 a.m. that the Board adjourn into Executive Session to discuss information relating to litigation strategy in pending or future litigation. The motion was seconded by Trustee Chefetz and on call it was approved according to the following vote:

COVID UPDATE

Mayor Zaccaro provided the current statistics of the pandemic in New York State and Suffolk County, which unfortunately were trending in the wrong direction due to the contagiousness of the Delta variant affecting both vaccinated and unvaccinated people. He stated that the Village in consultation with the Medical Advisory Committee will continue to monitor the situation and current CDC guidance, and based on how the situation unfolds may revisit requirements or recommendations for mask-wearing in all public facilities.

DISCUSSION OF ELECTRIC BIKES IN SALTAIRE

Mayor Zaccaro stated that many residents have expressed concern about the proliferation of electric bikes within the Village and the safety risks that they present. Discussion ensued about what is required for the Village to adopt legislation to effectively regulate the use of electric bikes within the Village, as well as other enforcement practices that could be employed. The Village Attorney outlined some of the prerequisites that must first be resolved in order to consider adopting a local law regulating electric bikes, which would preclude a local law from being adopted before the end of the season. Mayor Zaccaro stated that he and the Village Attorney will look into strategies to be able to quickly adopt legislation, or, failing that, the use of emergency powers to control the use of Electric Bikes.

Trustee Chefetz returned to the meeting at 9:33 a.m.

CONSIDERATION OF CREATING A CONSTABULARY

Trustee O'Brien reported that he had met with the Village Attorney, Village Administration and Public Safety staff to gather information regarding the possibility of creating a Constabulary in the Village of Saltaire, and had previously submitted a report to the Board and had discussed the topic at prior meetings during the year. He stated that those discussions resulted in very little community feedback either in favor or opposed to the concept. He once again outlined the pros and cons of creating a constabulary which would impart Peace Officer status to those officers of the Public Safety staff designated by the Board. After discussion and all having a chance to be heard, Trustee Chefetz made a motion to conduct a public hearing at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting to consider adoption of a local law to create a Constabulary for the Village of Saltaire. The motion was seconded by Trustee O'Brien and the motion was carried according to the following vote:

RATIFICATION OF RELEASE OF PUBLIC EASEMENT

Mayor Zaccaro stated that one of the conditions of the land exchange and stipulation agreement with the owner of 33 Bay Promenade was that the easement owned by the Village, that currently forms a small part of the access to 34 Bay Promenade, would revert back to the owner whenever the owner obtained a building permit for the property that demonstrated need for the land upon which the easement lies for their Department of Health (DOH) sanitary approval. Village Administrator and Building Inspector Posillico stated that the DOH permit has been granted and that the subject property upon which the easement lies is necessary for installation of the sanitary system pursuant to the approved design. Village Attorney Prokop reported that by virtue of the stipulation agreement and the submission of the DOH permit, the easement has automatically reverted back to the owner and the Village's rights have been extinguished. After discussion, and all having a chance to be heard, Trustee O'Brien made a motion to ratify the extinguishment of the subject easement that was created by the stipulation agreement between the Village of Saltaire and the owner of 33 Bay Promenade, and authorize Village Attorney Prokop to take any necessary actions to formalize the extinguishment with the relevant recording agencies.

The motion was seconded by Trustee Oppenheimer and the motion was carried according to the following vote:

CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE

Mayor Zaccaro reported on the status of the following capital projects:

- Village Administrator Posillico reported on the results of the RFP that he conducted to hire a third-party consultant to develop a code-compliant floor plan and exterior rendering of "Plan B" as well as a code-compliant floor plan for the existing building at 14 Bay Prom. He stated that all three proposals received were well in excess of the budget limit of \$7,500 set by the Board of Trustees, with the lowest proposal in the \$30,000 range. Trustee Oppenheimer stated that he would look at the provisions of the RFP to see if it can be pared down to meet the budget. After further discussion and all having a chance to be head, no motion for action was made.
- Playground: The SCA has indicated a willingness to fund a portion of new playground equipment to replace the current 30-plus-year-old equipment that now exits. Mayor Zaccaro stated that the Village in conjunction with the SCA will develop specifications and a budget for the project with the goal of having it completed by either the summer of 2022 or 2023.

- Ferry Operation: Mayor Zaccaro reported that the he, Trustee Oppenheimer and Administrator Posillico met with an Ad Hoc group made up of Village residents Andy McAllister and Marty Shaw to investigate the Village's options for more frequent and exclusive ferry service to Saltaire. They have initially identified a management arrangement structure as a preferred method to achieve those goals, along with potential grant funding to assist with the capital acquisition necessary to support that proposed management arrangement.
- FIMP: Mayor Zaccaro reported that the five south-shore Towns in Suffolk County have signed the necessary Project Partnership Agreements (PPA) to become the local sponsors of the FIMP project, and that the Village had executed the Intermunicipal Agreement (IMA) with the Town of Islip as the Town required as a prerequisite for its participation. Mayor Zaccaro stated that the Village is working with the Army Corps, the State, and the FIA to move forward as expeditiously as possible both the ocean beach stabilization project and the bay project in Clam Pond Cove.

Village Deputy Village Clerk/Treasurer Leppicello left the meeting at 11:30 a.m.

FIRE PREVENTION MEASURES

Mayor Zaccaro stated that he met with Saltaire Fire Chief Raeben regarding the Inlet Walk fire to identify challenges and opportunities to mitigate the risk of future fires as well as to facilitate the response of the SVFC to fire and other emergencies. Discussion ensued regarding those measures, including adding a requirement of residential fire sprinkler systems for new or substantially-improved residences, location of propane tanks, and the possible widening of private walkways that serve homes on Clam Pond Cove.

Village Treasurer Lyudmer left the meeting at 12:00 p.m.

AUTHORIZATION FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON LOCAL LAW TO REGULATE ELEVATORS Mayor Zaccaro reported that the Village Attorney and Administrator Posillico in conjunction with Trustee O'Brien have worked on a draft local law to address both zoning and code compliance issues regarding platform lifts and elevators, which was distributed to the Board and posted on the Village website. After discussion and all having a chance to be heard, Trustee Oppenheimer made a motion to consider such an amendment to Chapter 55 of the Village Code regulating platform lifts and elevators at a public hearing scheduled for the same date as the next scheduled Board of Trustees meeting.

The motion was seconded by Trustee O'Brien and the motion was carried according to the following:

After discussion and all having a chance to be heard, Trustee O'Brien made a motion to preliminarily list the subdivision application of Ivan Saks as an Unlisted Action for the purposes of the State Environmental Review Act (SEQRA), and to consider the full application and undertake a full SEQRA review at a public hearing scheduled for the same date as the next scheduled Board of Trustees meeting.

APPROVAL OF CONTRACT TO RELOCATE ELECTRIC FACILITIES ON BAY PROMENADE Village Administrator Posillico reported that the Village Administration received a charge letter from PSEG Long Island to relocate overhead electric facilities to an underground location along Bay Promenade from Pacific Walk to Navy Walk in the amount of \$115,219.17. He further stated that PSEG provided a sketch of the proposed work to be accomplished by this work order, which has been presented to the homeowner who has offered to donate private funds toward this project. Mayor Zaccaro stated that previous Village Boards had in previous budgets included a public contribution of \$25,000 for this project, which has been delayed considerably by COVID and other factors. After discussion, and all having a chance to be heard, Trustee Chefetz made the following motion:

RESOLVED that the relocation of the overhead electrical wires from Pacific Walk to Navy Walk along Bay Promenade to an underground service is an aesthetic and safety benefit to all residents of Saltaire, and further be it

RESOLVED that the Village Administrator be authorized to execute the necessary agreement documents with PSEG Log Island to relocate the overhead electrical wires from Pacific Walk to Navy Walk along Bay Promenade to an underground service for a fee not to exceed \$115,219.77 to be scheduled in the 2021/22 off-season, and further be it

RESOLVED that the Village Administrator is authorized to accept a donation of up to \$92,000 from a homeowner along Bay Prom to be used exclusively to help offset the cost of the relocation of the overhead electrical wires from Pacific Walk to Navy Walk along Bay Promenade to an underground service, and further be it

RESOLVED that the Village allocate \$25,000 from its general reserves to fund the portion of the cost to relocate the overhead electrical wires from Pacific Walk to Navy Walk along Bay Promenade to an underground service not covered by private donations.

RESOLVED that the Village Administrator is authorized to sell the surplus and may utilize any reasonable method to realize the fair-market value for the property, or to donate or otherwise dispose of any portion that cannot be sold in whole or in part.
